Florence Price was an American classical composer, pianist, organist, and music teacher.[2] Born in Little Rock, Arkansas, Price was educated at the New England Conservatory of Music, and was active in Chicago from 1927 until her death in 1953.

Price is noted as the first African-American woman to be recognized as a symphonic composer, and the first to have a composition played by a major orchestra. Price composed over 300 works: four symphonies, four concertos, as well as choral works, art songs, chamber music, and music for solo instruments.

After her death, much of Price's music was forgotten. In 2009, a trove of her manuscripts was discovered in an abandoned house, sparking renewed interest in her work. Today, her music is performed by major orchestras around the world, and she is recognized as a vital voice in American classical music.
