

#### A MESSAGE FROM FR. MATHEW

Dear People of God,

I greet you all in the blessed name of Jesus Christ. As I write this letter, we are in the middle of the pilgrimage together in the Season of Holy Lent. A variety of activities marked the season for us at St. Barnabas this year. We started this journey with Pancake Supper or Holy Tuesday Supper together in our fellowship room and our Ash Wednesday services (at noon and in the evening) with the imposition of ashes. I am delighted to say that later on during this season; our Sunday school organized a program called Sandwich Saturday. The children and their families from our community came together at St. Barnabas to prepare sandwiches, and these sandwiches were distributed in a local homeless shelter.

The Season of Lent presents an invitation to us: It invites us to self-examination, repentance, and above all to discover the grace of God available to us through Jesus Christ. Lent invites us on a journey to take up spiritual initiatives. #### **CONGRATULATIONS TO DENNIS DI VINCENZO**

In the Episcopal church a Eucharistic Minister is a lay person licensed by the bishop to administer the consecrated elements of the eucharist. Lay eucharistic ministers may be licensed



to administer the consecrated bread and wine at any celebration of the eucharist in the absence of a sufficient number of priests and deacons to assist the celebrant. They may also be licensed to go from a Sunday eucharist or other principal celebrations of the eucharist to share the sacrament with members of the congregation who were unable to be present at the celebration because of illness or infirmity. Lay eucharistic ministers may be licensed for either or both ministries.

At St. Barnabas we now have four Eucharistic Ministers serving at the altar. In addition to Dennis, they are Sharon De Vivo, Sabina Gaston and Kathy Mau. Our beloved brother, Dave Cobleigh who passed away this year, also served in this capacity for many years at St Barnabas.
